Adelphi Fall 2006 Facts

I. Enrollment Statistics

- About 60% of Adelphi students are undergraduates.
- Among undergraduates, 84% are full-time, while 27% of graduate students are full-time.
- The undergraduate programs with the highest enrollments are Arts & Sciences (38%), Nursing (25%), and Business (11%).
- Education has the highest graduate enrollment (47%), followed by Social Work (27%) and IAPS (11%).

II. Student Demographics

- Three-quarters of undergraduates are age 24 and under. Among graduate students, the largest age group is 20 to 24 (28%), followed closely by 25 to 29 (26%).
- Overall, three-quarters of Adelphi students are women. While women comprise 73% of undergraduates, 81% of graduate students are women.
- About one-third of Adelphi students are minority students; 37.5% of undergraduates and 27.5% of graduate students belong to minority groups.
- Seven percent of undergraduates are from out-of-state and 4% are international students; 3% of graduate students are from out-of-state and 3% are international students.

III. Financial Aid

- Almost all full-time financial aid applicants receive aid.
- Institutional aid was awarded to three-quarters of undergraduates.
- The average financial aid package was \$14,500.

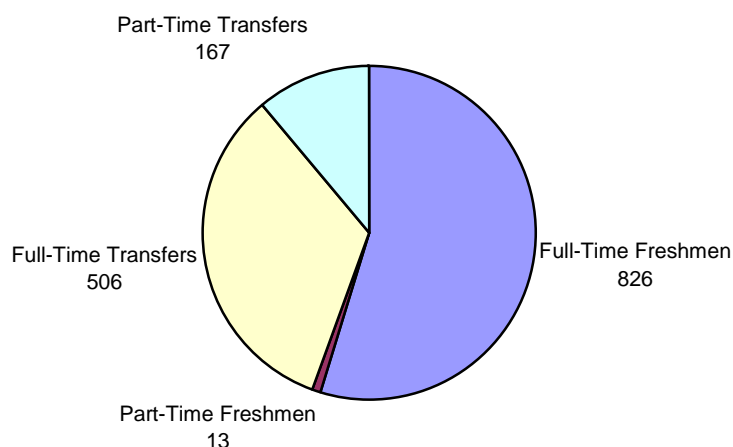

IV. New Undergraduate Students

- Over two-thirds of first-time freshmen applicants were accepted, as were half of transfer applicants.
- Among the first-time freshmen accepted, almost one-quarter enrolled, while 57% of accepted transfer applicants enrolled at Adelphi.
- Only 1.6% of freshmen enrolled part-time, compared to 25% of transfers.

V. Faculty

- The vast majority of Adelphi full-time faculty hold a terminal degree (90%), and nearly half (47%) are tenured.
- Half of all full-time faculty are women, and almost one-fifth of faculty are from underrepresented race/ethnic groups.
- The student/faculty ratio for both undergraduates and graduate students is 10.7 to 1.

VI. Degrees Awarded 2005-2006 (summer, fall, spring)

- Most baccalaureate degrees were awarded in Arts & Sciences (32%), followed by Nursing (19%) and University College (15%).
- The majority of master's degrees were awarded in Education (51%), Social Work (24%), and Business (11%).
- Of the 31 doctoral degrees conferred, the majority (27) were in IAPS, while the remaining (4) were in Social Work.
